Residuals

- Constant daily neck pain and frequent headaches
- Constant daily radiating right arm and hand pain, numbness and tingling
- Prolonged sitting causes pain
- Routine daily activities causes pain (e.g., driving, blow drying hair, getting dressed)
- Physical activity level permanently restricted
- Pain interferes with sleeping
- Grip weakness of right dominant hand
- Can no longer enjoy horseback riding, skiing, tennis, roller blading
